Expectations

- Reading The children in will continue to come home each Monday with an extract appropriate for their age group. We will be studying this extract in our whole class reading sessions throughout the week. Please encourage your child to read this extract aloud to you to practice their fluency. From Tuesday onwards each week the children will be reading sections of this extract aloud in class.
- School uniform Please check that all of your child's belongings are clearly labelled so that they can be returned to him/her if they go missing. There are some 'lost property' pegs in the cloakroom where staff will put all unlabelled items of clothing.

Ways to Help your Child

- Reading In addition to the whole class extract, which your child will bring home on a Monday, they will also have a library book. They may or may not need your support accessing this book as it will be one they have chosen themselves based on their interests. Please help them with this and enjoy reading it together. Children will be encouraged to change their reading books independently when they are ready however adult support and guidance will be available for those that request it.
- Times tables Children will need to use Times Table Rockstars at home 3 times a week. All

- **Spelling** Thank you for your support last half term with spellings. We will be testing the children on these during the first week back in February. Please continue to practice the spellings from their learning logs at home. Next half term's spellings are listed below and we will begin to look at these in class up to Easter. If you could continue to work on these with your children that would be great.

What we will be learning this term

report.	As the children should know all their times tables by this point practising building up their speed of recall would be beneficial. Focus on those tables your child struggles to recall quickly. Please ask if you are unsure where to start with this.

Other Curricular areas:

This half term we will be continuing to extend our learning linked to early 20th century history. We will complete our work on the changing role of women during the First World War before starting to look in more detail at the Second World War. Our art lessons last half term focused more on developing our sketching skills and observational drawing. We are now ready to find out more about the Victorian artist and botanist Marianne North. We will be finding out about some of the places she visited in Asia which inspired many of her pieces of artwork.

In science we will be furthering our knowledge of living things and their habitats, looking at classifying animals and plants into groups as well as life cycles. This will link to our work on biomes in geography where we will be focusing on grassland and temperate forest biomes. The children will find out more about the animals and plants that live and grow in these areas of the world and how they have adapted to survive. Healthy Me is our next PSHE unit. During these lessons the children will be thinking about the dangers of smoking and alcohol along with the idea of body image and the need to view ourselves in a positive light. PE sessions will focus on striking and fielding games such as cricket and rounders. Our work in Spanish will continue and in RE the children will be linking their learning on inspirational leaders to different religious leaders and why they may be viewed as inspirational.
