Expectations

- **Reading** The children will continue to come home each Monday with an extract appropriate for their age group. We will be studying this extract in our whole class reading sessions throughout the week. Please encourage your child to read this extract aloud to you to practice their fluency. From Tuesday onwards each week the children will be reading sections of this extract aloud in class.
- **School uniform** Please check that all of your child's belongings are clearly labelled so that they can be returned to him/her if they go missing. There are some 'lost property' pegs in the cloakroom where staff will put all unlabelled items of clothing.

Ways to Help your Child

- Reading In addition to the whole class extract, which your child will bring home on a Monday,
 they will also have a library book. They may or may not need your support accessing this book as it
 will be one they have chosen themselves based on their interests. Please help them with this and
 enjoy reading it together. Children will be encouraged to change their reading books
 independently when they are ready however adult support and guidance will be available for those
 that request it.
- **BEDROCK** Please encourage your child to complete BEDROCK at home at least once a week to consolidate their learning in school https://app.bedrocklearning.org/
- **Times tables** Children will need to use Times Table Rockstars at home 3 times a week. All children have a login for this programme which is a fabulous resource to help children learn their tables https://ttrockstars.com/
- Spelling Thank you for your support last half term with spellings. We will be testing the children
 on these during the first week back in January. Please continue to practice the spellings from their
 learning logs at home. Next half term's spellings are listed below and we will begin to look at these
 in class up to February half term. If you could start to work on these with your child after the
 Christmas break that would be great.

Other Curricular areas:

This half term we will be finding out more about early 20th century history specifically Britain's role in the First and Second World Wars. We will be finding out what life would have been like for people living in Britain during the Second World War, the role of women in the war effort, rationing and the holocaust. Through our Art lessons, we will be looking at the Victorian artist and botanist Marianne North. We will be finding out about some of the places she visited in Asia which inspired many of her pieces of artwork. Our own artwork will then focusing on observational drawings and we will further develop our sketching skills.

In science we will be thinking about how light travels, looking for patterns in the way shadows can be changed and how the eye works. We will find out more about physicists CV Raman and Profession Colin Webb. Dreams and goals is our next PSHE unit. During these lessons the children will be thinking about their strengths and setting realistic goals for themselves as well as discussing how to achieve these goals and remain motivated. During our PE sessions we will be further developing our skills in gymnastics. We will also be continuing with our sports education, this time with netball. The children will once again have the opportunity to take on the role of captain, coach, referee as they work in the same teams each week. Our work in Spanish will continue and in RE the children will be thinking about inspirational heroes and leaders. We will be thinking about what makes a good leader and what we can learn from them.
